

Informed consent



Before you start participating in the project, you will be asked to sign an informed consent.

The consent tells the researcher that you accept what it means to participate.



Before you sign the consent, the researcher needs to tell you:

- What the project is about
- Which information they will collect about you
- What you are going to do in the project
- If there are any risks



The researcher also needs to tell you if someone is going to take your picture or videotape you.

You can decide if you want this or not.



It's important that you get this information in a way that you understand. You have a right to speak to the researchers so that you have a chance to ask questions.

You also have the right to get it in a text that you can read. Then you can read about it when you want.



When the researcher have told you all information, you can decide if you want to participate or not.

If you want to participate, you will sign the consent. If you can't sign it yourself, your legal guardian or caregiver can help you.
